In the United States, environmental racism negatively affects Black Americans, Asian Americans, Native Americans, Pacific Islanders, and Latino populations. Protecting God's creation and those who are disproportionately affected by the climate crises is more than our belief as United Women in Faith; it is one of our core principles and a matter of justice!



Greetings UWFaith Sisters!

We have passed the midpoint of the year, so a few notes. Just an FYI: As you can see in the first half of the year report below, donations for Missions are \$14,494.62. Our pledge for 2024 is \$40,000 so we have given 36% of our pledge. For Emma Norton Services, we have given \$2,561.48. Our goal was \$10,000, so we have given 26%. We thank you for your hard work, and hope that you and your units have a great, blessed successful second half of 2024.

It may seem like a good idea to submit your **remittances** at the end of each year; however, it really helps the District and Conference treasurers if you send them in by the beginning of December at the latest. This gives us time to post them and send them to the next appropriate level. Deb, Linda Oberg and Teri really appreciate your efforts!

We believe it has been mentioned before that **rules for giving** have changed. Any donation that is a defined UWFaith project should still be submitted to the District Treasurer. The main items are Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition (SMR), Gift To Mission (GTM), Gift in Memory (GIM), World Thank Offering (WTO), Love Offering, Call to Prayer, Emma Norton Services, Mission u, and Assembly. The Legacy Fund should be sent directly to National to this address: United Women in Faith, Attn: Legacy, Church Center for the United Nations, 777 United Nations Plaza, 11th Floor, New York, NY 10017. All other missions should be sent directly to that mission. A good example is Ronald McDonald House. If you have questions on a specific mission, please send an email to Deb Jensen (debjen_mad@yahoo.com) and Teri Arnold (jonandteriarnold@hotmail.com). We will investigate and let you know.

If you need copies of remit or SMR forms, please send a request to either of the email addresses above. Please specify if you want paper or electronic copies. It is important that we get remittance forms so we credit the appropriate line item. Thanks.

We are both available to help local treasurers with any finance questions. We will work to find appropriate answers. Emails do work well so we can investigate if necessary, but we are also happy to take phone calls – Deb's number is 815-535-3710 and Teri's is 507-273-3812. We do ask that you leave a message if we are not able to get to the phone - that way we know who is calling.

COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS

As a District officer, you have opportunities to grow spiritually, intellectually, socially and in leadership skills. Working together we continue to serve God's will and purpose in the world by improving individual lives, families, and communities through the programs that are sponsored by United Women in Faith. The District officers work as a team supporting each other. Computer skills for email and Zoom are useful and can be learned. As we age, it is recommended and important to learn new skills and continue to have social contacts. Each officer contributes their own style to the office but follows basic guidelines. Sorry, as you can see I am a detail person, and I have more details for each position. Call or email, if interested, leave a message.

Volunteers and recommendations are greatly appreciated.

Thank you for those continuing and for new officers. Several spots still need to be filled. Who would fit in? You? It is always a learning process, especially the first year, but as a team we work together, help each other and appreciate each other.

Here are some general responsibilities and some perks for members of the team:

Leadership Responsibilities: Attend & participate in meetings, executive meetings (some will be via Zoom), attend Conference Annual Gathering and Conference Leadership Training, usually the first Saturday in October. Inform the District President if you are unable to attend. Contribute articles to the district newsletter. Provide training for local officers. May provide a short mission moment relation to their position at each district meeting. Attendance at one session of Mission u is strongly encouraged.

Leadership Perks: Expenses of your office are paid from the Administrative & Development Funds. Registrations must be made by the deadline for the district to pay expenses. You must register for meetings, voucher mileage, voucher Mission u registration & mileage, response magazine and other expenses of your office. Sharing rides to events is encouraged and saves mileage payments.

TERMS of OFFICE: Elected offices are for a two-year term, with the option of serving another 2nd term in the same office. Appointed officers are now one year at a time, with a limit of four years in the same office. Tenure is serving a total of 8 years (2 or more offices) unless a woman is elected as President. Committee on Nominations can be up to four years and does not count towards tenure. Someone who has served tenure, after four years may serve in a different office for one term, 2 years.

TREASURER'S responsibilities are currently set up for two people. Are you a numbers person or an accountant? We need you! One person accepts, deposits and issues all monies. The second person does all the recording/bookwork, currently in Excel (or use another bookkeeping program) and presents information at Executive Committee meetings and yearly reports including the audit. This position is for two years but is usually continued for 2 more years, even an additional (3rd) two-year term is available.

NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE: Identify & recruit officers as needed that reflect the diversity of the membership. Explain fully the job responsibilities, descriptions are available, time commitment, dates of meeting, attendance requirements. Ideally this committee shall have a totaling membership of eight (8) divided into four (4) classes. The chair should have 2-3 years remaining on the committee, serving as Chair for two years only.

PROGRAM COORDINATOR plans with the help of the Leadership Team, the logistics of the Spring and Annual Gatherings with a theme. Publicizes the meetings in the district newsletter, develops, coordinates and prints programs for each event. More details available. National social issues are often themes.

Social Action Coordinator: provides education to members to understand how, why and where they can participate in activities that could provide change in social issues. The national office usually has three main issues on which to focus. Current issues are Climate Justice, Social Justice and Soul Care.

Education and Interpretation Coordinator: provides a short mission moment at each district meeting, helps members understand where the money goes and provides displays. She encourages local units to participate in "Mission Today," receives the reports and awards the certificates.

Please pray and discern how we can use your talents.

Discerning God's Call on Your Life

"Be who it is God created you to be and you will set the world on fire" (Catherine of Siena,14th century Catholic Italian mystic)

I share that quote of Catherine of Siena's on numerous high school graduation cards, encouraging graduates to embrace their unique mission in life, as they respond to the call to be their deepest and truest

selves in response to being created, known and loved by God. Of course, like most sentiments expressed on cards, this reality can be far more challenging to attain. Discovering what we are meant to be and do isn't just for high school graduates starting out in life. It's a question that we all return to numerous times over our lifetime.

To discern is to diligently search and examine. A discerning mind demonstrates wisdom gained from knowledge and learned experience, as well as insight beyond what is seen and heard. In the Christian faith, discernment involves seeking God's guidance and is a gift of the Holy Spirit. It involves relying on God's wisdom and making choices aligned with God's purposes.

In the notable Biblical example recorded in 1 Kings 3:9 ("So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong."), King Solomon asks God for wisdom to rule God's people. This prayer of Solomon's pleases God, who not only gives him wisdom, but also riches and honor.

Entire books have been written about the process of spiritual discernment, but basically it involves listening for God's direction and guidance for our lives. This requires that we be tuned into God's voice through the reading of Scripture, prayer (speaking and listening – personally, I find contemplative prayer practices to be very helpful in this), reflecting on what we believe we have heard from God, and speaking to other people of faith, whose wisdom and insights we respect.

In their book, "Stretch out Your Hand, Exploring Healing Prayer", authors Tilda Norberg and Rober Webber write, "God speaks in many different ways, and grace gives us the eyes to see and the ears to hear...The important thing is to pray for the grace to know God's voice, to test it a bit, and then to act in faith on the discernment given, trusting that God will correct us if we have not heard quite clearly."

In 2016 I was discerning a call to serve as a Deaconess in the United Methodist Church. As a part of discerning my call to this life-time commitment to full-time ministries of love, justice and service I attended a UMW Lay Leadership Days event in Arizona, where I was given the opportunity to learn more about the Deaconess Home Missioner Order, ask questions, and seek guidance from other people of faith. That was a part of my process to clarify my call to the DHM Order. By the way, if you believe God may be calling you to serve as a Deaconess Home Missioner in the United Methodist Church, you have an opportunity to attend a virtual discernment event, "Who Am I Called to Be", being held over zoom on October 26. Please see the event flyer in this newsletter for more information. (on page 9)

Whatever it is that God is calling you to be and do in this world, I pray for God's clarity and guidance for you as you pursue that calling.

"A Prayer of Unknowing" by Thomas Merton (pg. 79, "Thoughts in Solitude") My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following Your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please You does in fact please You. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that, if I do this, You will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore I will trust You always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and You will never leave me to face my perils alone. Amen.

I recently downloaded a copy of United Women in Faith's Annual Report for 2023*, titled "Inspire Influence Impact". I'll highlight for you excerpts of comments by both President 'Anise 'Isama'u and General Secretary & CEO Sally Vonner.

Sally wrote "No matter what may come in the days ahead, we will get through it if we, like Proverbs 4:25 says, 'Let your eyes look directly forward, and your gaze be straight before you', supporting and being in mission with women, children, and youth for generations to come. We are influencers and inspirers! We can make an impact! Believe it!

'Anise wrote "Dream it, believe it, do it. These are not just words; they are the pillars of our renewed faith and determination. The dreams we carry within us are the sparks that inspire change. They are the visions of a better world for women, children, and youth. We must believe in the power of our collective action to bring these dreams to fruition. But belief alone is not enough. We must act - we must "do it" to make an impact.

From the Annual Report I'll highlight just a couple of statistics that show the impact UWFaith has had both nationally and internationally in 2023. 283 students in the US and around the world received scholarships totaling nearly \$650,000. National Mission Institutions (such as **Emma Norton Services**) were able to serve nearly 130,000 women, children, and youth through United Women in Faith grants.


I just wanted to pass these comments and figures along to you so that you can see where some of our mission money is put to use.

After years of planning, Emma Norton Services met a huge goal this spring with the opening of *Restoring Waters*. About 30 women from the former Robert Street residence moved in during April. Since then 25-30 additional residents are now at home in the new facility, so the building's 60 units are mostly occupied.

A wonderful Grand Opening celebration was held on May 14, which many United Women in Faith women were able to attend. St. Paul Mayor Melvin Carter spoke along with several

other local officials, representatives from Ryan Brothers (the construction company), Executive Director Tonya Brownlow, and one of the residents. Over 200 people toured the building. And, despite this rainy spring, the weather was perfect!

Now the "settling in" phase is in progress. The building offers facilities for many kinds of enrichment for the residents—exercise opportunities, cooking and nutrition classes, gardening on the rooftop, etc. These activities will unfold as the residents begin to build their new community. Meanwhile, the good work at Emma's Place and Scattered Site housing continues.

ENS hired a volunteer coordinator this spring. Maureen (Mo) Mayberry brings youth, energy, and a willing spirit to her job. Going forward, she will be a great resource for scheduling on-site volunteer activities and coordinating the in-kind donations that the women of UWFaith have such a long and generous history of providing. You can continue, of course, to bring donations to the district meetings, but should you wish to donate anything directly, please contact Mo at mmayberry@emmanorton.org to set that up as one of the changes with the new building is that they now request that donations be dropped off by appointment. Lastly, the Capital Campaign for Restoring Waters is in its homestretch. 

The Four Winds – A Novel by Kristin Hannah

The novel begins in Texas, 1921 – a time of prosperity following the end of the Great War, until Elsa meets Rafe and the direction of her life changes. Then comes the combination of the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl. Hard times fall on everyone, but especially the farmers, and Elsa has an impossible decision to make as the water dries up and the crops fail. Throughout the story Elsa is dealt one hardship after another, but she never loses her courage to fight back a she continues to make personal sacrifices for the people she loves.

Elsa moves to California where she's told jobs are plentiful, but she soon learns the harsh realities of how many desperate workers are trying to get hired for the few available jobs. Once she manages to get a job she finds out how farm workers are treated by the owners — the long hours, low pay and that they are required to use the Company Store at exorbitant prices, making sure that they will always remain poor and dependent on the rich farm owners. Elsa fights back against the injustice and risks everything, including her life to bring change.

The Four Winds is a riveting story of the struggles and tragedies of the time, but also what hope and courage can accomplish. The author brings this period of time to life in ways our history books didn't. And it has a great romance plot as well! What more could you want in a book?




First Nations Version IVP: From the First Nations Version translation of the Bible $\ensuremath{\mathbb{C}}$

We recognize that we are on the Mni Sota Makoce(Land Where The Waters Reflect The Clouds), the ancestral land of the Dakota people. Our neighborhood once was farmland for Governor Alexander Ramsey, whose goal for Minnesota was to drive the Dakota out of the state for good. Our Methodist movement was active in boarding schools designed to destroy Native culture. While we cannot undo the harm done by Ramsey, or the Methodist Church of the past or any of our ancestors, we can honor the history and gifts of indigenous people in the Americas. The First Nations Version of the Bible was translated by eleven Native American people representing fifteen different tribes. This version of The Lord's prayer comes from the First Nations Version of The Bible.

Oh Great Father, the one who lives above us all your name is sacred and holy. Bring your good road to us where the beauty of the world above is reflected on the earth below. Provide for us day by day the elk, the buffalo, the salmon, the corn, the squash, the wild rice. All those good things we need every day to feed our families. Release us from the things we have done wrong, in the same way we release other to the things done wrong to us. Guide us away from selfish desires that tempt us to stray from your good road and rescue us from that evil one and his worthless ways. Your great road, with its great power and beauty shines like the sun to the time beyond the end of all days. Amen.
